The History Department of the University of Massachusetts Boston invites applications for a tenure-track assistant professor in early modern European History, c. 1500-1750. The appointment will begin September 1, 2012. Geographical regions and areas of specialization are open (excluding Italy). We encourage candidates whose work focuses on political, social, and/or cultural history and those who use interdisciplinary approaches. We are also interested in applicants who can contribute to our interdisciplinary Atlantic World program. The successful applicant will be expected to teach survey courses in World History and/ or Western Civilization, as well as upper level and graduate courses in his/her areas of specialization. A doctoral degree is required and must have been awarded no later than June 2012. Candidates must demonstrate a strong commitment to scholarship and to teaching excellence in an urban public university.
