

One Year Retention Rates for Fall Entrants 1997-2002 Cohorts

This report examines one year retention rates by student entry type. First time freshmen are reported in full and part time groups as are transfers with freshman status (0-29 credits) and transfers with sophomore or higher status (30 or more credits on entry and identified as “Other Transfer” in this report). The overall retention rates by student entry type and year are presented in Table 1 on the following page. More detailed tables by race/ethnicity and college begin on page 5.

Notes on All Tables

- Native Americans are not reported because of small N-size, but they are included in the “All UMB” rates as are those with missing race/ethnicity.
- Cape Verdeans are not reported in a stand alone category because of small N-size, but are reported as part of the Black non-Hispanic (Black NH) category as they would be for national reporting.
- Freshman or transfer status is determined from the Admissions File
- Freshman or higher level class standing is determined by the number of transfer credits noted in the Admissions File.
 - This does not always match the credits at the beginning of the student’s first semester as noted in the Enrollment File.
- CPCS students are included in the retention rates by Race/Ethnicity for fall 1997- fall 2000. For 2001 and 2002, they are reported in the “First Time Freshmen” and “All Transfer Students” categories but not in the transfer categories that are reported by entry level because of difficulties ascertaining the entry level of CPCS transfer students.

Overview of Retention by Entry Status

The first time full time freshman retention rate has been stable since 1997, ranging from a low of 67.4% in 1998 to a high of 69.7% in 2002 with a combined rate of 69.2% over the period. First time part time freshman rates have been considerably more volatile and much lower over the same period. The low was 40.5% in 1999 with a high of 57.8% in 1997 and a combined rate of 47.8% over the entire period. The difference in retention rates between full and part time freshmen was statistically significant for each year. About 15% of all first time students from 1997-2002 carried a part time load during their first semester. This was fairly stable and ranged from a low of 11.7% in 2001 to a high of 16.8% in 2002. While the jump in the part time rate from 2001 to 2002 is

statistically significant, it appears to be an aberration, since the percentage of fall 2003 freshman entrants who attended part time fell to about 7%. The number of full time freshman entrants also rebounded in 2003 to a total of 567 students.

The full time transfer freshman retention rate has been somewhat less stable than that of first time full time freshmen since 1997, ranging from a low of 61.3% in 1999 to a high of 70.7% in 1997 with a combined rate of 65.7% over the period. Part time transfer freshman rates have also been somewhat unstable over the same period, although they tended to be somewhat higher than those of part time first time freshmen over the same period. The low was 50.5% in 2002 with a high of 59.0% in 1997 and a combined rate of 54.2% over the entire period. While there appears to be a pattern of steady decline in the retention rates of these part time transfer freshmen, the differences are not statistically significant. However, we will pay particular attention to this when we assess the 2003 cohort. The difference in retention rates between full and part time transfer freshmen was statistically significant for every year but 1999. About 34% of all transfer freshman students from 1997-2002 carried a part time load during their first semester. The percentage of transfer freshmen who attended on a part time basis during their first semester ranged from a low of 30.9% in 1998 to a high of 38.0 in 1997.

The “Other Transfer” full time student retention rate has been fairly stable since 1997, ranging from a low of 71.1% in 2001 to a high of 76.7 in 1999 with a combined rate of 73.8% over the period. Part time “Other Transfer” student rates have also been fairly stable over the same period but at a lower level. The low was 58.7% in 1999 with a high of 65.5% in 1998 and a combined rate of 61.1% over the entire period. The difference in retention rates between full and part time “Other Transfer” students was statistically significant for each year. About 37.9% of all “Other Transfer” students from 1997-2002 carried a part time load during their first semester. This was fairly stable and ranged from a low of 37.0% in 2002 to a high of 40.8% in 1997.

Part time status is a particular issue for first time freshmen. From 1997-2002 part time freshmen were retained at a rate 21.3% below that of full time students. For transfer freshmen, the difference was 11.5%, and for “Other Transfer” students it was 12.7%.

Retention Rates by Race/Ethnicity and Entry Status for All UMass Boston

Retention rates by race/ethnicity within entry category are difficult to properly assess because of the relatively small numbers within each category by year. Detailed tables begin on page 5. For the four larger U.S. resident known race groups of first time full time freshmen, the pattern has been fairly stable since 1995. Asian Pacific Islanders had consistently had the highest retention rates and White non-Hispanics the lowest, with Hispanics and Black non-Hispanics either the second or third position from 1995 through the 2001 cohorts. This changed somewhat in 2002. For the first time since at least 1995, Black non-Hispanics had a retention rate below that of White non-Hispanics. However, the difference between the two groups is not statistically significant in 2002, and the difference between the Black non-Hispanic rate for 2001 and Black non-Hispanic retention rate in 2002, while almost 9 points, is also not statistically significant.

What may be of concern is that the proportion of Black non-Hispanic first time freshmen who were enrolled part time during the first semester almost doubled from 11.2% in 2001 to 21.6% in 2002. Hispanics were also more likely to attend part time in 2002 than in 2001, as were International students and the group as a whole. The importance of part time attendance during the first semester cannot be overstated. Over the six year period, for every group except the International students, the difference between the retention rates for part time and full time students within each racial/ethnic group and overall were statistically significant for first time freshmen and transfer freshmen. For the "Other Transfer" group, the difference between the part time and full time students retention rates were statistically significant for the Asian Pacific Islander students, the Unknown/Refused group, White non-Hispanics, and the group overall. Table 2 on the following page has details of the differences. Note that the differences for first time freshmen are particularly pronounced.

For all racial/ethnic groups and transfer types, the only statistically significant difference in retention rates between 2001 and 2002 is that the retention rate of white non-Hispanic “Other Transfer” full time students increased from 67.9% to 77.0%.
