



**Articulation Agreement  
Between Quincy College and UMass Boston**

**I. Guarantees and Conditions of Articulation Agreement**

1. UMass Boston assures the acceptance of Quincy College graduates who earn an Associate Degree\* with a 2.0 or higher prior to transferring to UMass Boston. Guaranteed admission applies to student where Quincy College is the most recently attended school. Students who attend other colleges after Quincy College will need to meet general transfer admission standards. Guaranteed admission does not apply to Nursing, Engineering, Management, or Communications. Other majors or programs may also be excluded based on limited availability or special requirements.
2. Quincy College graduates will receive academic credit for all courses successfully completed at Quincy College that were applied toward their associates degree, if they enroll in the aligned UMass Boston bachelor's degree (see Exhibit A). Up to 70 credits can be accepted.
3. A grade of C- or better must be attained to receive transfer credits into UMass Boston. Developmental, internship/practicums, and ESL courses are not eligible to transfer in. Quincy College students are encouraged to connect with transfer counselors at UMass Boston to ensure courses transfer in and apply toward their intended major.
4. If a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course because they have not taken introductory courses or achieved the required grade, the student will be required to take the necessary prerequisite(s). Therefore, UMass Boston cannot assure every student the completion of requirements for the bachelor degree in a specific number of terms or semesters. However, students with the aligned associate degree from Quincy College may be able to finish in two years if they follow the prescribed curriculum and course load and complete all classes.
5. The UMass Boston catalog contains all information about the degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their bachelor degree program to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper level courses are encouraged to communicate early with an admissions counselor at UMass Boston to secure specific information about their transfer credits.
6. Quincy College graduates completing an approved associates degree (see Exhibit A) will be awarded the "Quincy Gen Ed Transfer Block" provided all required general education requirements are successfully completed within the associate's degree program and meet the C- minimum to transfer. The Quincy Gen Ed Transfer Block provides applicable transfer waivers to students as detailed below:

#### II. Oversight



3. The two institutions will be in communication regarding changes in curriculum, admission requirements, deadlines and the mailing of acceptance letters.
4. The Academic Advising Office at Quincy College will inform eligible graduating students of this partnership.

**III. Term of the Agreement**


1. This agreement will be reviewed every three (3) years and may be revised by mutual agreement.


