# WHO SHOULD TAKE SPAN 101: Elementary Spanish I

Students who have never studied Spanish before. (Webcape Placement exam required) Students who have taken fewer than 2 years of high school Spanish. (Webcape Placement exam required)

Students learning Spanish as a foreign language and score between 0 and 239 on the computerized Webcape placement exam. The exam is administered in the Testing Center in the Campus Center.

PLEASE NOTE: Native or heritage speakers of Spanish should NOT take SPAN 101. They should take the written placement test administered by the Hispanic Studies Department: M-4-618. Call: 617 287 7550.

# WHO SHOULD TAKE SPANISH 102: Elementary Spanish II

Students who have successfully completed 1 semester of university-level Spanish.

Students who have taken 2–3 years of high school Spanish. (Webcape Placement exam required)

Students learning Spanish as a foreign language and score between 240 and 315 on the computerized Webcape placement exam. The exam is administered in the Testing Center in the Campus Center.

PLEASE NOTE: Native or heritage speakers of Spanish should NOT take SPAN 102. They should take the written placement test administered by the Hispanic Studies Department: M-4-618. Call: 617 287 7550.

## WHO SHOULD TAKE SPANISH 201: Intermediate Spanish I

Students who have successfully completed 2 semesters of university-level Spanish. Students who have taken 3–4 years of high school Spanish. (Webcape Placement exam required)

Students learning Spanish as a foreign language and score between 316–426 on the computerized Webcape placement exam. The exam is administered in the Testing Center in the Campus Center.

PLEASE NOTE: Native or heritage speakers of Spanish should NOT take SPAN 201. They should take the written placement test administered by the Hispanic Studies Department: M-4-618. Call: 617 287 7550.

# WHO SHOULD TAKE SPANISH 202: Intermediate Spanish II

Students who have successfully completed 3 semesters of university-level Spanish.

Students learning Spanish as a foreign language and score between 427 and 560 on the computerized Webcape placement exam. The exam is administered in the Testing Center in the Campus Center.

#### PORTUGUESE LANGUAGE PLACEMENT

## **PORT 101:Elementary Portuguese I**

Designed for students with little or no background in the Portuguese language. Portuguese 101 focuses on the acquisition of basic listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills within a cultural framework.

#### WHO SHOULD TAKE PORT 101

Students who have never studied Portuguese before.

Students who have taken fewer than 2 years of high school Portuguese.

PLEASE NOTE: Native or heritage speakers of Portuguese should NOT take PORT 101. They should take the written placement test administered by the Hispanic Studies Department: M-4-618. Call: 617 287 7550.

## **PORT 102:Elementary Portuguese II**

A continuation of PORT 101. Portuguese 102 focuses on furthering the acquisition of basic listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills within a cultural framework.

### WHO SHOULD TAKE PORT 102

Students who have successfully completed 1 semester of university-level Portuguese. Students who have taken 2–3 years of high school Portuguese.

### **PORT 201: Intermediate Portuguese I**

Further development of language skills, with readings in Portuguese and Brazilian literature and civilization.

### WHO SHOULD TAKE PORT 201

Students who have successfully completed 2 semesters of university-level Portuguese. Students who have taken 3–4 years of high school Portuguese.

## **PORT 202: Intermediate Portuguese II**
