Academic Admission Requirements

An undergraduate degree. One year each: Biology, Inorganic Chemistry, Organic Chemistry, Physics, English. Some schools may also require a full year of Calculus; it is recommended to discuss your math plans with the premedical advisor.

AMCAS opens up each May and can be submitted starting in June. <u>Transcript requests</u> should be sent to the Registrar's office ASAP.
