UMBrella

- <u>UMBrella</u> is a one-stop search and discovery tool for books, e-books, videos, articles, and so much more.
- Sign in using your UMass Boston network ID and password to renew your library items, save items to your bookshelf, export citations for bibliographies, and view items and resources available at UMass Boston as well as from other institutions.
- Use the UMBrella chatbot for immediate research help.



Ask a Librarian

Course Reserves

- Use the library **Request Form**: physical and electronic resources
 - Digitization requests for ADA compliant chapters
 - Requests to purchase
- Submit the form with your reserve lists as soon as you are able.
- Electronic content links: review the links every semester, to confirm that access to it has not changed. This includes article permalinks, streaming video, and e-books offered in UMBrella.
- Add personal copies loaned to Course Reserves email department <u>library.reserves@umb.edu</u>
- Search for available course reserves in UMBrella with a dedicated search filter



Interlibrary Loan (ILL)

- The ILL service allows you to request items that we don't have. Items include electronic articles and book chapters which will be delivered in PDF format to you. Physical items including books, and DVDs can also be requested and picked up using our curbside pickup service.
- You can login to ILLiad using your UMB email.
- Email accounts are created automatically upon enrollment or employment. Read more about email activation here.

Using Our Partner Libraries

- <u>Boston Library Consortium (BLC)</u> (Requires BLC Card)
 On-site borrowing privileges at Boston-area academic libraries with a <u>BLC card</u>.
- <u>Fenway Library Organization</u> (FLO)(Requires UMB ID)
 Students, faculty, and staff must present a valid UMB ID card to visit those libraries. Check with individual college and universities libraries for access policies.
- Massachusetts Commonwealth Consortium of Public Higher Education Institutions
 (MCLPHEI) (Requires UMB ID)
 Direct borrowing privileges at 29 campuses in Massachusetts state at higher education libraries with a current UMB ID. Check with individual libraries for borrowing policies.
- Boston Public Library (BPL)
 - The Boston Public Library is also a research library and any student or resident in Massachusetts is eligible for a <u>Boston Public Library (BPL) card</u> or an <u>eCard</u>. Use either card to remotely access electronic resources.



Reference Managers

Reference managers allow you to organize a personal database of resources that you can use to create citations and bibliographies. We support both Mendeley and Zotero.

Mendeley

 Your research content is primarily scholarly and contained in PDF files. Mendeley has a strong social network and community platform.

Zotero

 Your research content is diverse. Zotero can gather citation records for non-PDF content easily. Zotero's single-click capture works with databases, catalogs, and websites.
