

Arnold Arboretum at Harvard University



Home to more than 15,000 plants from over 4,000 different species, the Arnold Arboretum in Boston is considered one of the best arboretums in North America! Several of the plant species are endangered or even extinct in the wild. Head to the arboretum with a group to see beautiful blooms or even attend one of their many annual events like Lilac Sunday on May 12th.

When: Monday through Sunday, 7 am – 9 pm, Lilac Sunday May 12th

Where: 125 Arborway, Boston, MA

<u>Directions:</u> From the JFK/UMass station, take Bus 16 to Forest Hills via South Bay Center—this bus runs every 30 minutes. Get off at the Forest Hills stop and walk about 15 minutes.
