When: Nov. 10 at 11 AM through Dec. 31 at 9 PM

<u>Direction</u>: Take the Red Line inbound from JFK/UMass station to South Station. Transfer to the Sliver Line and get off at Courthouse. Walk for about 3 minutes.

When: The time and date vary.

<u>Directions</u>: If you are taking the orange or green line, get off at Haymarket and walk for about 4 minutes. If you are taking the red line, you can get off at the downtown crossing and take the orange line to Oak grove and get off at Haymarket.

<u>Tickets</u>: The price ranges from \$5-\$35

<u>Directions</u>: Take a red line at Downtown crossing that goes to Alewife and get off and Harvard station. Walk for about 7 mins.

Boston Prudential Tower



Enjoy the 360-degree view of Boston from the iconic Prudential Tower. You can enjoy both indoor and outdoor views from inside of the tallest observation deck in New England at any time of the year. They have a couple of restaurants that you can pick from. They don't allow any food or drinks, or pets (assistance dogs are allowed).

Where: 800 Boylston Street, Boston, MA 02199

When: From 10:00am – 10:00pm

<u>Directions:</u> From Downtown crossing, take an orange line that goes to Forest hill and get off at Back Bay. Then walk for about 12 mins

<u>Tickets:</u> The ticket price varies. For Standard, it's \$29.99; Combination is \$39.99, All-inclusive is\$49.99 and they come with their own benefits.

Zoo Lights at Stone Zoo



Visit the Stone Zoo to view the beautiful sparkling lights that are holiday themed! The whole entire zoo that covers 26 acres of land is filled with lights. <u>When:</u> 4pm – 9:30pm (last entry is one hour before closing)

<u>Directions:</u> Take the Orange line to Oak Grove and get off at Malden Center. Take 132 Redstone bus and after taking 20 stops, get off at Pond St and walk for about 3 mins.

<u>Tickets:</u> Price varies but they are usually within the range of \$13 - \$19.

Middlesex Fells Reservation

Where: 4 Woodland Rd, Stoneham, MA 02180

When: They're open from Sunrise to sunset

<u>Directions</u>: Take the Orange line to Oak Grove and get off at Malden Center. Take the 132 Redstone bus and after taking 19 stops, get off at Fellsway E and walk for about 2 mins.

<u>Tickets</u>: Free! (Unless you are renting a boat. If you are the price ranges from \$20 - \$35 and they offer discount on Thursdays)

Ice-Skating at the Frog Pond, Boston Common

Frog Pond in Boston Commons is turned into an ice-skating rink from November to March each year, but it is a good idea to go before it gets too cold! Where: Boston Commons Frog Pond: 38 Beacon Street, Boston, MA

When: Begins mid-November, repeats daily. Closed for Christmas and New Years.

<u>Directions:</u> From UMass/JFK station, take the Red Line inbound to Alewife. Get off at Park Street and walk five minutes there.

<u>Tickets:</u> \$8 admission plus \$15 to rent skates. https://bostonfrogpond.com/ice-skating/

Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum



Do you enjoy seeing beautiful artwork accompanied by incredible plants? Not only is the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum a wonderful place to be, but they host free evening admission (3-9 pm) on the first Thursday of each month. These evenings are accompanied by the addition of spectacular lights and musicians in the courtyard so viewers can appreciate the museum through a different lens.

When: December 7

<u>Directions</u>: From UMass/JFK station, take the Red Line inbound to Alewife. Get off at Park Street and transfer to the Green Line E, outbound to Heath Street. Get off at the Museum of Fine Arts stop and walk five minutes there.

<u>Tickets</u>: Thursday night tickets are free but advanced registration for timed-entry passes is encouraged. Available two weeks in advance. https://tnew.gardnermuseum.org/31844/32156

First Night Boston 2024



A New Year's Eve celebration of artistic performances wonders of the season, and the beginning of a New Year. The First Night celebration will open 2024 with the First Night Parade that will take groups from City Hall Plaza to Boston Common at 6:00 PM. Once the performers pass by, the public is invited to walk along to the Boston Common, where fireworks will begin at 7:00 PM. There will also be Ice Sculptures in City Hall Plaza, at Boston Common, and along the waterfront. They will be available for public viewing from 12:00 noon to 12:30 AM.

Where: City Hall Plaza, Boston Common

When: December 31

<u>Directions</u>: Green Line/Red Line for Park Street Station to Boston Common or Orange Line to Downtown Crossing Station and walk to the Boston Common. Green Line/Blue Line to Government Center Station for City Hall Plaza or Orange Line to Haymarket Station and walk to City Hall Plaza (It is strongly recommended to use the MBTA that day due to high volume of visitors)
