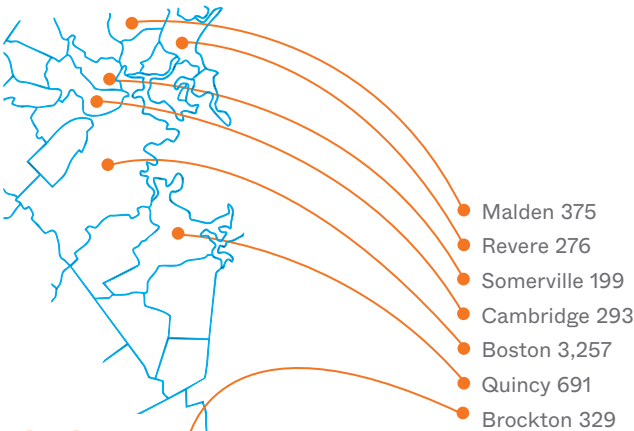
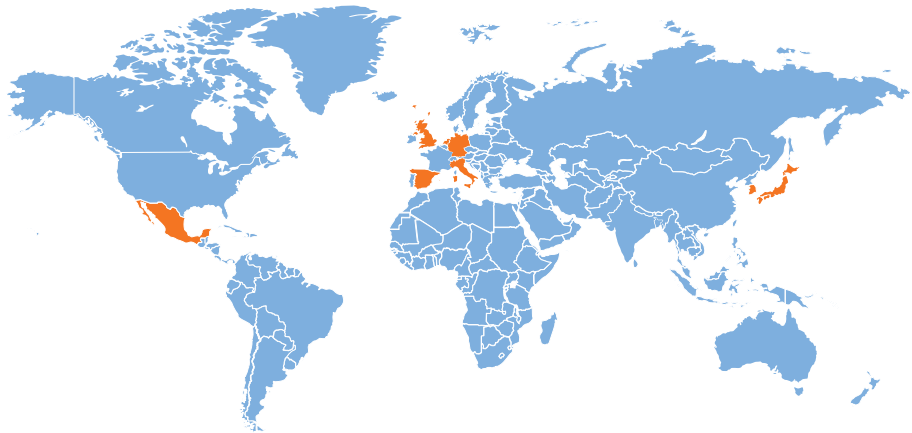

UMass Boston, with 15,428 enrolled undergraduate and graduate students in fall 2025, is nationally recognized as a model of excellence for urban public universities. The university's 6 colleges and schools offer 69 undergraduate programs and 150 graduate programs (including master's and doctoral programs). The Honors College serves 443 students who thrive on intellectual challenge. Enriched courses probe more deeply into theory or venture further into the application.

UMass Boston's diverse student body provides a global context for student learning. Its location in a major U.S. city provides connections to employers in industries such as finance, health care, technology, service, and education. Students are offered many opportunities to gain valuable in-school experience via internships, clinical, and other career-related placements.

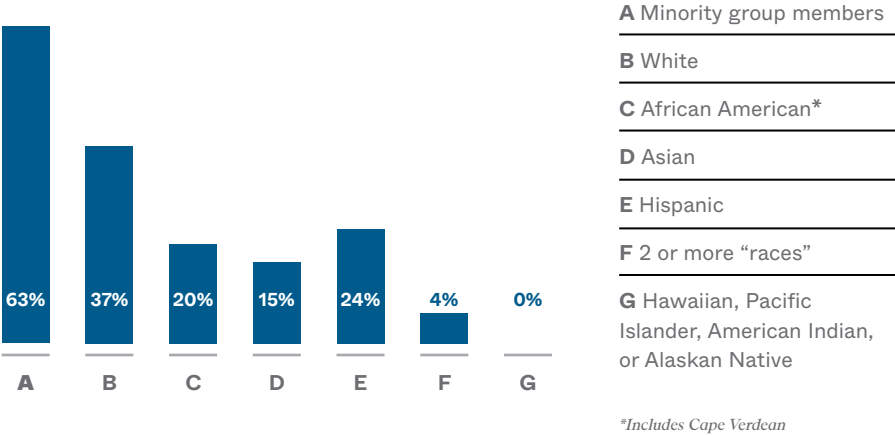

Note: International students and students not reporting race/ethnicity are excluded.

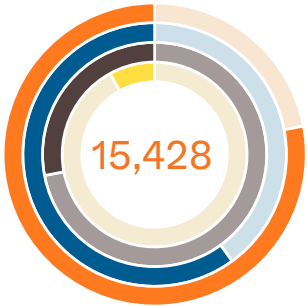

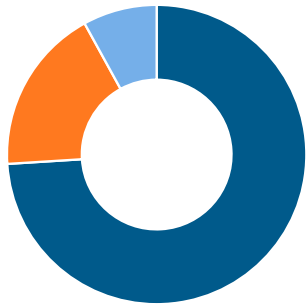

Fall 2025 Student Statistics



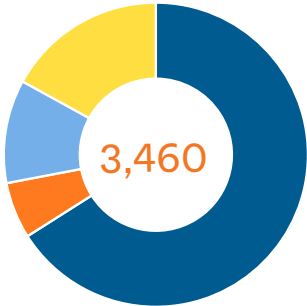
