Accelerated Master's Program in Applied Sociology

An accelerated master's program is available for eligible UMass Boston students interested in applied sociology. By entering this program, students can earn both a bachelor's degree in their field of interest and a master's degree in applied sociology in less time than earning these degrees separately.

Students interested in social service or research related careers in healthcare, criminal justice, substance abuse, public affairs and urban planning, business, law, education, political science, or international careers should find this accelerated option supports and enhances their planned career path.

FACULTY AND RESEARCH EXPERTISE

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Accumulated 80-90 undergraduate credits (30 must be taken at UMB) no later than the second semester of junior year
- Completed undergraduate coursework must include:
 - SOCIOL 101 Introduction to Sociology
 - SOCIOL 201 Sociological Theory
 - SOCIOL 202 -Methods of Sociological Research
- Minimum 3.2 undergraduate G.P.A.
- Completion of the Writing Proficiency Examination

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The BA/MA students follow the same academic program as MA students once they complete undergraduate coursework.

- 103 undergraduate credits
- 37 graduate credits
- Internship or Teaching Seminar
- Capstone options:
 - Master's Thesis
 - Master's Research Paper
 - Comprehensive Examination
- Minimum 3.0 G.P.A.

GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS

AMP students are eligible for graduate assistantships upon completion of their undergraduate program.

Students typically receive half of an assistantship or 9 hours of work, 50% tuition waiver, and a stipend.



APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants must submit the following to the Office of Graduate Admissions through the online application portal by the application deadline: October 1 (spring admission), March 1 (fall admission).

 - One (1) academic writing sample
 - Two (2) academic letters of recommendation
 - All undergraduate transcripts
